



Golden State Water Company Modifies Water Restrictions for Most Service Areas

After the three driest years on record, recent rain and snowfall have dramatically changed conditions for many parts of California, leading the **California Department of Water Resources to deliver 100% of requested water supplies, up from 75% announced in March.**

In response to these conditions, Governor Newsom issued an executive order that eased drought emergency provisions. The order maintains the ban on wasteful water use.

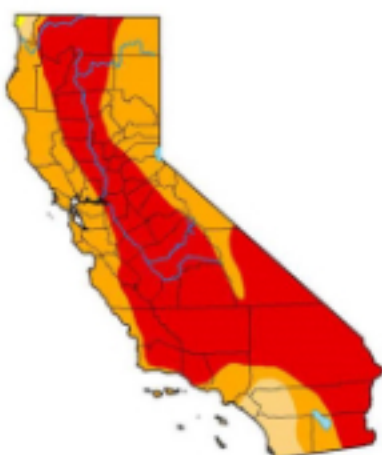
Effective May 14th, Golden State Water Company is shifting from Stage 2 to Stage 1 water restrictions, allowing outdoor watering three days a week.

This new policy comes with exceptions. The Nipomo, Cypress Ridge, and Edna Road customer service areas will not make this transition due to conditions that were present before this historic drought. Although these areas have benefited from the recent historical precipitation, it remains to be seen how this has affected local groundwater supplies. Due to the continual long-term decline in water basin levels, additional conservation efforts are still needed by all customers in these service areas.

Given that water conditions will continue to evolve, customers are encouraged to use water wisely, only using what is needed and not one drop more.

We would like to extend a special thanks to our customers who have reduced their water consumption and those committed to promoting water conservation as a way of life for the future.
